

# Membership

Many members found the Club through friends who were already members. Some discovered Windycrest by visiting for a regatta. Some members are long time sailors who are new to the area. Regardless of how you found us, membership is a fairly straight forward process.

A membership application and fee schedule can be found in PDF form on the Windycrest website. After deciding to apply, you will be invited to a Board of Governors meeting (the first Monday of each month). We like to meet all prospective members, and get their view on sailing and how they can be an active, interested member. Sailing experience is not required.

Membership is limited to boats less than 29 feet in length and weighing less than 6,000 pounds. Windycrest is a "do it yourself" Club, regular dues are reduced by 50% when you earn work party credit by attending the annual All Club Work Party.

Regular memberships include both keelboat and centerboard boats. A completed application with proper dues payment must be submitted before approval for membership will be granted. We usually have a waiting list for water space. We do require membership before being put on the water space waiting list. We have membership options for keelboat owners while they wait for dock space. Contact the Vice Commodore to discuss options that will work for you.

Associate Members use the Club but do not own boats. Most associate members are in the training programs or crew on regular members boats. We also have Racing, Special, and Sustaining memberships.
