BOARD OF GOVERNOR'S MEETING

Windycrest Sailing Club Board of Governors Meeting Minutes 02 November 2009 (draft)

The BOG convened at 6:40 pm in the Sand Springs Case Community Center on November 2nd, 2009. Governors present were Tina Birch, Jo Ann Chandler, Allene Donley, Rex Donley, Steve Elliott, Tucky Patz, Tom Proctor, and Danny Ziegler. Members present were Kenny Baggett, Darline Hobock, Steve Snider and Jack Stewart.

Welcome: Steve welcomed Doug Lewis to the new Board of Governors and welcomed the guest members to the November Board meeting. Recognizing Steve Snider's request to address the Board, he turned the floor over.

Steve Snider thanked the new Commodore and stated that Windycrest was all set for Boat Show again next year. It will be Monday, February 1st through Sunday, February 7th. He will again set up the booth and have volunteers manning it; signup will be handled closer to the event date. One thing Steve will do differently this year is to rig an Opti and have it setting out for children to crawl on and to promote the Junior program. Steve would like to offer free admission to the Chili Cook-Off to those who at the Boat Show that express sincere interest our Club and the sailing programs. Steve would also like to have Saturday, Feb 6th, at the Boat Show "Junior Sailor Day" by scheduling the junior sailors to the volunteer hours. Saturday is typically the day where more families come through the show and Steve would like to have the juniors out there to entice possible memberships. Steve will have more signage and literature

addressing adult training, youth training and the MS Regatta as there was more interest and feedback concerning these than anything else. He might also have a listing of the boats for sale.

Secretary's Report: The minutes from the October 5th BOG meeting were approved as published.

Windword Editor: Rex reported that the Annual Meeting and Oktoberfest turned out well; there was lots of help, good attendance and that it was a great day. The Turkey Fry is this Saturday with 76 reservations so far received. Turkeys will be injected Friday night and frying will begin about 1:00 pm Saturday so that all will be ready to eat by 5:00 pm. Two turkeys will be fried this year with only rosemary, thyme & basil, the rest being injected with Cajun spices.

Facilities Manager's Report: Jack picked up the truck the club purchased, said it was running nicely and has made some of the things he does at the club a bit easier. There was a large water leak where a hose had separated and the water was running into the lake. Jack fixed it and assured us of no more high water months. The club changed refuse haulers to A1 Refuse out of Mannford and already better service has been observed. Last Friday afternoon with a 40mph wind out of the west, the older section of the breakwater lost 3 of the floats out from under it.

The service company will come out tomorrow to see if they can get the floats back under. It is anticipated that repairs would be under warranty. The roll up shade on the west side of the Pavilion tore off the night after Oktoberfest. Jack will rig a tarpaulin for the Turkey Fry, but suggested we not replace the shade until springtime.

Treasurer's Report: Tom disclosed that the main expense this past month

was the Club insurance and that we were at the point where we've dipped into the reserve funds and will be operating from that reserve for the remainder of the year.

After much discussion, the Board of Governors proposes to increase

BOG Letter To The Windycrest Membership

The Windycrest Sailing Club has given the Board of Governors several primary responsibilities. In no certain order the BOG should:

- Be good stewards of the club and its facilities
- Encourage the pursuit of the sport and recreation of sailing
- Provide a safe environment for members and guests
- Maintain fair and equitable operating rules

We are writing to you today in regard to our current financial health. At the completion of our fiscal year ending January, 2010, we will have a deficit of over \$13,000.

This year alone, we have had infrastructure repair expenses of \$39,000

- \$28K for the launch dock,
- \$11K for the breakwater (which broke again a few weeks ago)

We will continue to have major repair needs for the club:

- All boat docks need repairs to decking and superstructure
- The retaining wall behind the pavilion is not far from a major overhaul
- Additional repair or replacement of the breakwater is in our immediate future

The last time we had a dues increase was to pay for modifications to the pavilion. At that time, the Board had the insight to create a 'rainy day fund' to which the club would contribute at the rate of \$10,000 a year. However, to meet the demand to keep the club safe and in good repair, the board has had to dip into the 'rainy day' funds for the past several years. Those funds need to be replenished for future emergency needs.

To offset the rising costs and deteriorating infrastructure, the WSC Board is proposing a 10% across the board increase effective with the 2010 dues. You will find more details elsewhere in this month's Windword.

In September of 1996, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) was 157.8. In September, 2009, the CPI was 215.834. The CPI net increase in those 13 years is 36%. That is to say, in general, what you paid \$1.00

for in 1996 costs you \$1.36 today. But our dues in 1997 were the same they are today: \$250 for Part A and \$250 for Part B. If we had implemented a policy in 1996 to keep our dues in check with inflation, dues today would be \$340 for Part A and \$340 for Part B.

This proposed increase brings us to a CPI of 173.58; approximately the level of the CPI in October, 2000. Even with the proposed 10% increase, we are still 9 years behind. Because we have neglected the financial side of the organization for so long, we will also consider more frequent, much more moderate increases in the future. In order to bring our revenues in line with today's costs, the membership should expect additional dues increases over the next 3 or 4 years.

Other options are also being considered to balance the budget. This is the first step in what may likely be a long line of changes in fiscal management to meet our responsibility to be good stewards of the club.

During this economic downturn, where many of our members are out of work or fearful they may be out of work, is not the best timing we could choose. As a result, we have tempered the need to bring our revenues in line with our expenses. Instead of the 36% increase that we should be considering, we are only considering a moderate 10% increase for fiscal 2010. The purpose of this increase is to allow the BOG to plan for and fund the much needed infrastructure repair that we are anticipating.

No one likes dues increase, but the fact of life is that it costs more to live today than it did yesterday. In order to sustain the club for future generations of sailors we must be more fiscally responsible. I know you will be able to support this increase for the future of the club.

The Board is requesting your ideas and opinions, by mail (use the WSC PO Box address), email or at the next meeting of the Board. We have discussed this with members of the 'Old Hulks', WSC members at large and at board meetings. We respectfully request your input as soon as you can provide it.

Notice of proposed amendments to By-Laws pursuant to Article VI, Section 1.

The following amendments to the Club By-Laws were proposed at the Board of Governors meeting on November 2, 2009 and will be formally considered for adoption at the December 7, 2009 meeting of the Board of Governors.

Proposed amendments to By-Laws

Article XII

Sec. 2. Associate memberships may be granted to crew members and other non-boat owners. Such memberships do not carry the right to vote, or skipper a boat, but do include the use of Club facilities. Such a membership shall include the spouse and children as defined in Section 1 above. The Board of Governors, at its discretion, may regulate the number of Associate memberships, ~~and the same shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the regular membership of the Club.~~ If an Associate member acquires a sailboat to be used on Club facilities, a Regular membership must be approved by the Board of Governors.

Article XIII

Sec. 2. ~~Any person seeking a regular or racing membership after May 31 of any year shall pay sixty percent (60%) of the annual dues.~~ Dues for any person initially seeking Regular, Special or Racing membership after March 1st of any year shall be prorated based on the number of full and partial months remaining in the fiscal year at the time of approval of their membership by the Board of Governors.

Sec. 3. The Annual Dues for Regular and Racing memberships shall be ~~\$500.00~~ 550.00 per year. These dues shall be divided into two parts. Part A shall be ~~\$250.00~~ 275.00 per year. Part B shall be ~~\$250.00~~ 275.00 per year and is due on or before ~~June~~ July 1 of each year. However, part B shall be waived if the member has qualified for a "work credit" by performing any of the following services to the Club prior to July 1 of each year.

- a. Attendance and registration at a regularly scheduled work party.
- b. Completion of a special work or service project approved by the Vice Commodore.
- c. Service as a member of the Board of Governors.
- d. All Past Commodores shall be exempt due to their previous service to the Club. Other Board members who have served two (2) consecutive years will be exempt the following year after service.

Sec. 4. The Annual Dues for Associate memberships shall be ~~\$70.00~~ 77.00 per year, regardless of the time of year such membership is approved.

Sec. 5. Annual Dues for Special memberships shall be ~~\$250.00~~ 275.00 per year regardless of the time of the year such membership is approved. These dues shall be divided into two parts. Part A shall be ~~\$125.00~~ 137.50 per year. Part B shall be ~~\$125.00~~ 137.50 per year and is due on or before ~~June~~ July 1 of each year. However, Part B shall be waived if the member has qualified for a "work credit" prior to July 1 of each year as defined in Article XIII, Section 4 ~~3~~.

Sec. 6. The Annual Dues for Sustaining memberships shall be ~~\$30.00~~ 33.00 per year.

Sec. 11. A late fee of \$25.00 will be assessed on all annual dues and fees not received by February 15, with an additional \$10 due March 1, and accruing each month thereafter ~~until the Board votes on whether to terminate the membership.~~ Dues and fees other than annual renewals will be due not later than 15 days after date of billing and late fee of \$10 per month or portion thereof will be assessed on all late payments.

dues and fees, including training, approximately 10% across the board for fiscal year 2010 with the exception that the Initiation Fee will stay the same and that the Associate Fee will raise to \$80. The Board of Governors also proposes to drop the Associate membership percentage limitation.

The Board of Governors additionally proposes to change Article 13, Section 2 from a 60% Annual Dues reduction after May 31st to a monthly proration for the remaining months in the fiscal year. Minor changes to clarify meaning and intent of current language were also proposed.

Renewals will be mailed to the membership no later than January 1st.

The Profit and Loss statement was approved as stated.

Activities Captain's Report: The Holiday Party has been finalized: December 12th, TiAmo Ristorante Italiano, 6034-A S. Sheridan, 6:30 pm; holiday casual attire. Tucky will meet with Danny to design something for the website. The Awards Ceremony is scheduled for February 27th. It will again be at the Jewish Community Center off of 71st street with a cheese, fruit and desserts sort of faire; details forthcoming.

Fleet Captain's Report: In Stephen's absence, Jo Ann shared that Steven is planning an off-season meeting for the racers and that he will submit his survey to Danny for inclusion on the website in hopes those who have yet to submit one or who would like to put more thought into it will have the opportunity to do so.

Webmaster's Report: Danny said the site was running smoothly and that if anyone would like to see something on the site to please just let him know.

Rear Commodore's Report: Doug professed he looked forward to being on the board and to serving the membership of Windycrest. Steve reinforced that Doug's main duty would be to take charge of the training program and welcomed Doug to the BOG.

Windycrest Oktoberfest Recipes

GERMAN CHOCOLATE UPSIDE DOWN SURPRISE CAKE

1 cup flaked coconut
 1 cup chopped pecans
 1 package German chocolate cake mix
 1 1/4 cups water
 1/3 cup oil
 3 eggs
 3 1/2 cups (about one pound) powdered sugar
 1 cup (2 sticks) butter, melted
 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened

Spray a 9x13 inch pan with Pam. Line with parchment and spray the lining with Pam.

Sprinkle coconut and pecans evenly over the bottom of the pan.

Combine cake mix, water, oil, and eggs at low speed until moistened, then beat two minutes at high speed. Spoon batter evenly over coconut and pecans.

Combine powdered sugar, butter, and cream cheese in another bowl. Beat until smooth and creamy. Spoon evenly over batter to within one inch of edges.

Bake at 375 for 40 to 50 minutes or until toothpick inserted comes out clean. Cool completely. Invert onto platter.

Serve warm or cold. Store in refrigerator.

The cream cheese mixture sinks during baking and forms a creamy layer that you will see when you serve. Note: the topping spreads while cooking so don't get too close to the edges and put a foil lined baking sheet under the pan while cooking.

RED CABBAGE

Recipe By: Tucky Patz

Serving Size: 10

1 head red cabbage -- (10 cups)	1 tablespoon flour
3 teaspoons salt	2 tart red cooking apples
2 tablespoons butter	
1/2 cup cider vinegar	
1/2 cup sugar	

Shred red cabbage.

In large pan combine cabbage, salt, butter, vinegar, sugar, and 1/4 cup cold water. Cook for 10-15 minutes.

While cooking cabbage, cut up apples into small pieces, leave on skin.

Add apples to cabbage and cook for another 10 minutes until tender but not mushy.

Sprinkle flour over mixture and cook until it thickens a bit, but not real thick.

NOTE: Windycrest Cruising fleet selection from lots of great choices! Tucky uses Smart Balance instead of butter.

GERMAN POTATO SALAD

SERVES 6 TO 8 AS A SIDE DISH

Unlike a non-stick skillet, a traditional skillet will allow the bacon to form caramelized bits on the skillet bottom. This will result in a richer tasting dressing and a more flavorful salad.

2 pounds small- to medium-size red potatoes (1 to 2 inches in diameter), unpeeled, scrubbed, and halved if small or quartered if medium, then cut into thick slices

Salt

8 ounces (about 8 strips) bacon, cut crosswise into 1/2-inch pieces

1 medium onion, chopped fine (about 1 cup)

1/2 teaspoon sugar

1/2 cup white vinegar

1 tablespoon whole-grain German-style mustard

1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley leaves

1. Place potatoes, 1 tablespoon salt, and water to cover in large saucepan or Dutch oven; bring to boil over high heat, then reduce heat to medium and simmer until potatoes are tender (thin-bladed paring knife can be slipped into and out of potatoes with little resistance), about 10 minutes. Reserve 1/2 cup potato cooking water, then drain potatoes; return potatoes to pot and cover to keep warm.

2. While potatoes are cooking, fry bacon in large skillet over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until brown and crisp, about 5 minutes. With slotted spoon, transfer bacon to paper towel-lined plate; pour off all but 1/4 cup bacon grease. Add onion to skillet and cook, stirring occasionally, over medium heat until softened and beginning to brown, about 4 minutes. Stir in sugar until dissolved, about 30 seconds. Add vinegar and reserved potato cooking water; bring to simmer and cook until mixture is reduced to about 1 cup, about 3 minutes. Off heat, whisk in mustard and pepper. Add potatoes, parsley, and bacon to skillet and toss to combine; adjust seasoning with salt. Transfer to serving bowl and serve.

NOTE: This recipe was more of guideline than actual rule!

The selection of Thanksgiving dishes, (dressing, gravy, salads, vegetables, home made bread and many great desserts) and 15 fried turkeys were enjoyed by the 135 that attended. PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE BARS

1 cup all purpose flour
 1/3 cup packed brown sugar
 5 T butter, softened
 1/2 cup finely chopped pecans or walnuts
 8 oz softened cream cheese
 3/4 cup granulated sugar
 1/2 cup Libby's Solid Packed Pumpkin
 2 eggs lightly beaten
 1 1/2 t ground cinnamon
 1 t ground all spice
 1 t vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine flour, brown sugar, cut in butter and add nuts. Set aside 3/4 cup of this mixture. Add the remaining mixture to an 8 inch by 8 inch pan. (if you use parchment paper in the bottom of the pan, it makes clean up easier) Press mixture down into pan. Bake 15 minutes at 350 degrees. Take out and cool.

Combine in a large mixing bowl the cream cheese, sugar, pumpkin, eggs, cinnamon, all spice and vanilla until smooth. Add to cooled crust. Sprinkle on reserved crust ingredients. Bake 30 to 35 minutes until golden brown at 350 degrees.
