BOARD OF GOVERNOR'S MEETING

Windycrest Sailing Club Board of Governors Meeting Minutes 04 January 2010 (draft)

The BOG convened at 6:35 pm in the Sand Springs Case Community Center on January 4th, 2010. Governors present were Tina Birch, David Briggs, Jo Ann Chandler, Allene & Rex Donley, Steve Elliott, Stephen Gent, Doug Lewis, Tucky Patz, and Tom Proctor. Members present were Darline Hobock, Blake Kelso, Steve Snider and Jack Stewart.

Secretary's Report: The minutes were approved as published in the Windword. Renewals will be mailed this week. In order to avoid a late fee, slip agreements must be returned signed along with payment in full by February 1st.

Facilities Manager's Report: The breakwater was repaired mid-December; however, on New Year's Eve one of the angle arms broke and a float got out. Jack will call to have it fixed. One of the mooring chains broke. Fortunately the boat attached stayed w/in the cove and Jack tied it to the dock.

Treasurer's Report: Tom passed out the financials along with the proposed budget. December saw little activity; interest received and property taxes paid. The budget for 2010 includes replacement of reserve funds we used this past year, anchors for the breakwater and pavilion repairs.

Tom pointed out that our major expense is the publishing and mailing of the Windword. Rex will find out the cost splits from Star Forms for layout and printing; regardless, the BOG wishes to pursue electronic distribution of the newsletter.

Another suggestion to save the Club money was to publish the Directory every other year; however, because of the By Laws changes it was decided to print the Directory as usual this year and revisit the suggestion at a future Board meeting.

Activities Captain's Report: Tucky spoke with the Zarrow Campus and all is set for our Awards Party on February 27th. The dessert theme will continue this year and all shall begin at 6:30 pm. Stephen will coordinate with Richard Fergusson on the Calendar. Tucky will contact the Fleet Captains and coordinate their sponsorships for the Club's monthly social events.

Fleet Captain's Report: Stephen passed out a draft sailing calendar. Proposed are separate Fleet spring and summer races and combined Fleet fall races with skipping the month of August or any race series due to heat and lack of wind. Party Barge and Jack and Jill Regattas are proposed along with a couple of Beach Parties; all with FUN in mind and to encourage everyone to enjoy their boats. Stephen will seek comments on his proposals at the KBHF's January 23rd meeting and a racers meeting early February; the calendar will be set in stone by the Awards Ceremony & Party. Stephen is also wanting to bring back t-shirts and/or hats for racers and will contact Kenny Baggett for cost ideas.

Rear Commodore's Report: Doug ordered 2 sailboat covers for the 420s and expects them to be shipped this week. The swim test is scheduled for May 22nd at the Sand Springs Salvation Army. A basic skills camp for the Junior sailors will be held June 14-18th with an advanced racing camp running June 28th-July 2nd. April 15th

We are having some nice weather, no? I noticed some ice forming in the cove the other day. Let me warn everyone to not walk on the ice. We don't want anyone to have an accident that could otherwise be avoided by resisting the urge to play carelessly. Hopefully, there are no viral Youtube videos of my frolicking on lake ice out there anywhere.

The club is always looking for ways to get the most out of our limited resources. One way we could save some money is to go to an electronic newsletter instead of the hard copy we mail to each member now. In the 21st century, we now have the ability to even include color pictures at no additional cost! It is well understood that some members do not have a way to get an e-Windword, so we would have to make exceptions for those folks. If anyone has any compelling argument for one way or the other, please let me or any other BOG member know.

So, how is anyone encouraged to pursue sailing as a recreational activity or competitive sport? It makes sense to me that one would be encouraged if that person could see what is in it for them; they have to get something positive out of choosing that particular course of action. In the interest of saving printing costs, I'll just hit the highlights of what sailing gives to me. It is kinetic; moving through space as well as time engages more senses and exercises body mechanics. Using the wind's energy to navigate seems to be environmentally friendly (although I'm not too sure about building fiberglass boats and using synthetic sails) and somewhat magical. Sailing allows me to operate relatively comfortably in an otherwise hostile environment; it literally expands my horizons. Its dependency on the natural elements promotes an increased intimacy with reality while at the same time affords a distraction from some man-made concerns. It can be a social exercise or a solitary pursuit. Both have their benefits. There are also intangible aspects that are difficult to explain or quantify. I would call it a kind of transcendent function. Aside from the mostly hedonistic benefits of being alive, sometimes sailing provides through its complexity of pleasures the opportunity for edification. Not only does it feel good, but I actually believe I am better after having done it. I don't mean to scoff at Faith, but with what may seem to be a paucity of meaning in the universe, I have somehow added some bit of meaning to my otherwise relatively insignificant existence by sailing a boat. Now, how cool is that?

Renewals are out, so let's all get them returned promptly. Please!

It's annual dues time again. Please remember that, per Article XIII, Sec. 1.d. of the Club Bylaws, all annual renewals are due in full on or before February 1 of each year, we do not have a partial payment plan. If you don't receive your renewal statement by January 30, 2010, please contact me and a replacement will be sent (preferably by e-mail).

We use the postmark date on your remittance to determine timely receipt, if postmarked on or before February 15, 2010 and properly addressed to Windycrest Sailing Club, Inc., Box 4731, Tulsa OK 74159-0731 it will be considered timely. If you are late, please include the appropriate late fee to preclude the expense to the Club of mailing additional billings.

New lease agreements are included with your renewal if appropriate. If you co-own a boat which has additional fees due (dock, mooring, etc.) one owner should pay in full or jointly send in your renewals. Your renewal cannot be completed until all fees are paid in full and a complete signed renewal form and lease agreement (if appropriate) is received. To help insure your inclusion in the annual directory, your completed renewal must be received prior to April 1, 2010.

Rear Commodore's Report

It's time to start thinking of getting signed-up for Windycrest training programs in the summer of 2010. If you are interested in learning to sail, the Windycrest training programs are a great place to start. It is a fun, low key, inexpensive place to begin. Minimum age to participate is 8 years old, and your never too old to learn.

Below is the schedule for Junior and Adult training programs. Juniors are for kids from age 8 to 18. Adult (SEA) programs are for any level of sailors in the Club.

- **Junior Basic Skills Camp** is scheduled for June 14, through June 18, 2010.
- **Junior Advanced Racing Camp** is scheduled for June 28, through July 2, 2010.
- **WSC Beginner and Advance Camps** start at 9:00 am and conclude at 4:00 pm each day.
- **SEA training** will begin on Thursday June 17, 2010, and continue for six consecutive Thursdays in a row, that's June 17, 24, July 1, 8, 15, and 22.
- SEA training sessions begin at 6:00pm and go till dark.

Instructions to register are as follows: Fill out the forms on-line. Print two copies, one for yourself and one for the Club. Be sure to sign the Club's copy in the appropriate spaces. Mail to: Windycrest Sailing Club; Attn: Doug Lewis; PO Box 4731; Tulsa, OK 74159-4731. Contact me

Because we have to maintain an instructor/participant ratio, registration will run from February 1, until April 15, 2010. Any registrations received after April 15, will be accessed a late fee of \$20.

There will be no registrations accepted after May 15, 2010. This will help us to plan for the number of participants and the number of instructors to be provided. It will also give us time to acquire enough workbooks and prepare the boats to be used for camp. The cost is listed below:


We will miss seeing Phil at Windycrest and in our Windycrest family.
