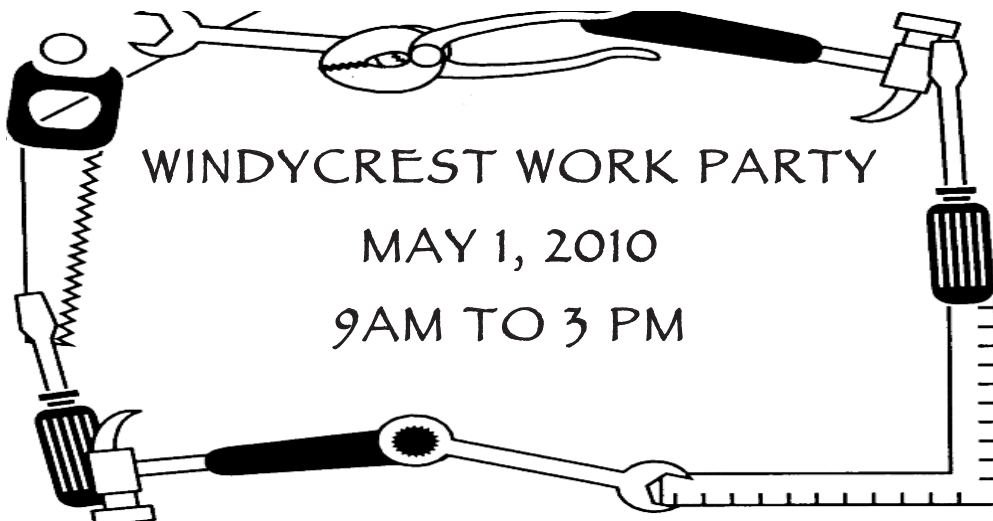

Windycrest Sailing Club Board of Governors Meeting Minutes 05 April 2010 (draft)

The BOG convened at 6:30 pm in the Sand Springs Case Community Center on April 5th 2010. Those present were Tina Birch, David Briggs, Jo Ann Chandler, Skeeter Chilton, Allene Donley, Rex Donley, Stephen Gent, Doug Lewis, Tucky Patz, Tom Proctor, and Steve Snider as well as Britney Carleson, Jennifer Scott, Phyllis O'Shannassy, and Randy Taylor.

WELCOME: The Vice Commodore presided in the absence of the Commodore. David offered the floor to Skeeter Chilton. Skeeter introduced her guests Britney Carleson and Jennifer Scott. Both are seeking Associate membership and will crew for Lisa Weatherholt on a J22. Phyllis O'Shannassy also is seeking Associate membership and plans to enroll in the SEA training, but does bring some sailing experience with her, crewing years ago on a 30' Dickerson sloop off the east coast of Florida. All were approved for Associate memberships; however, Phyllis' pending receipt of her application which had been sent to the Rear Commodore.

Tom requested and the BOG ratified the following Storage Rates per Article XIII, Section 12: Boat on water storage (included Board Boat dock, slip or mooring)- \$5 per day per item; Windyrest trailer lot- \$5 per day per item; Boat on trailer or boat trailer in dry storage lots- \$2 per day per item.

A motion was approved by the BOG to treat property of passing Members on a Case by Case basis.

ACTIVITIES CAPTAIN'S REPORT: Tucky will begin seeking a venue for the Holiday Party next month and is open to suggestions from the membership.

FLEET CAPTAIN'S REPORT: Stephen is ready for the race season to begin and has incorporated some fun events into the calendar. Jo Ann volunteered to submit the race results to the Tulsa World for Friday publication and Stephen will see to finding a volunteer to gather the results for Jo Ann.

Scuttlebutt

Originally a wooden cask set in a convenient part of the ship from which the men could draw their ration of water. The cask was refilled daily but to ensure that water was used sparingly it was "scuttled" which meant it had a small hole made on its side so that only half a cask could be filled at a time. Men lining up at the scuttlebutt for their ration of water would naturally exchange gossip which is what the word in America has come to mean. But faithful to its original it remains peculiarly the gossip heard at the office water cooler or fountain.

Rules: The ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012 as adopted and amended by US SAILING, CSSA Sailing Instructions and the Local Appendix will govern races. A boat entering as a member of a class must conform to class rules.

Safety: Standard safety equipment required including throwables and signaling device (16ft+ boats).

Scoring: Low point system:

- Five races are scheduled, of which one completed race shall constitute a series.
- Boats must have a sail number to be scored.
- Appendix A, rule A2 is modified so that each boat's series score will be the total of her race Scores.

Handicapping: Current US SAILING Portsmouth System. Skippers should verify that a US SAILING Portsmouth D-PN number has been established for their boat.

Trophies: 4 boats in a fleet = 1 trophy; 8 boats = 2 trophies; 12 boats = 3 trophies; 16 boats = 4 trophies. Plus special awards.

Housing: Free camping at Club with bathhouse. Some RV space available. Hotels in Sand Springs.

Facilities: Open pavilion, modern bathhouse, 3-boat wide ramp, ample parking, mast-raising device, water storage for keelboats, tie-up dock and board boat dock. Convenience store is one mile from the club.

Food & Drink: Free continental breakfast Saturday & Sunday morning. Free refreshments after race. Buy Saturday dinner.

Entry Fees and Costs: \$22.00 per boat; \$5.00 per crew. \$10.00 CSSA annual membership required for skippers (available at registration). **Junior sailors (17 and under) sail for free.** \$2.00 discount for US SAILING members; must show card. Saturday dinners are \$8.00 each and can be purchased at registration.

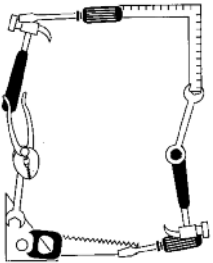
