Welcome: Steve welcomed everyone to the October meeting of the Board of Governors and began introductions. Patrick Hoey applied for an Associate Membership, stating that his total sailing experience was consisted of guest sailing with David Briggs, loving everything minute of it. Patrick wishes to join the club and learn to sail with his family. Patrick's Application was approved.

On behalf of Mary, Steve Snider gave an update on the Close/MS Regatta. Proceeds raised from the Moonlight Sail, Launch Party and Regatta, even though not all in, total close to \$70,000! Mark your calendars now for next year's events: the Moonlight Sail is scheduled for 18 June, the Launch Party for 18 August and Close/MS Regatta for the 10th of September with Mark Lobo serving as next year's Chairman. They will be sailing along with ten others as they make their way through the northeast Trades, the doldrums, crossing the equator towards one of the world's most unusual land falls, where the moai statues rise above the island, looking out to sea – Easter Island. Have fun finding Easter Island off the coast of Chili.
