BOARD OF GOVERNOR'S MEETING

Windycrest Sailing Club
Board of Governors Meeting Minutes
– March 6, 2012 (draft)

The BOG convened at 6:30 pm in the Sand Springs Case Community Center on March 6, 2012. Board members present were Doug Lewis (Commodore), Danny Ziegler (Vice-Commodore), Mike Jones (Rear-Commodore), Chris Gill (Fleet Captain), Pam Low (Secretary), Tom Proctor (Treasurer), and Judy Andrews (Activities Captain). Guests included Facilities Manager Jack Stewart, Windword Editor Barbara Montalbano, Steve Snider, Steve Riley, Bridget Drummond, Mike Palmer, and prospective members Greg Tiffany, Jason Williams, Eric Yost and Amanda Harrolle. Introductions of BOG members and guests were made. Greg and Susan Tiffany who have a Neptune 24, and Eric Yost and Amanda Harrolle who have a Catalina 27 made applications for keelboat memberships. Jason Williams has been an associate member in the past and has purchased a Hobie16 and applied for a centerboard membership. All three memberships were approved. Mike and Bridgett were in Texas and saw a rolling cradle boat lift frame for \$950. They thought the club might be interested in purchasing it. After discussion, the board felt it would be too much of a liability. Steve Snider requested that WSC host the Sunfish Ladies North Americans on September 14,15,16. It was moved and approved.

Facilities Manager's Report: Jack noted that there has been a sign on Prue Road informing everyone that Green Country Fire and Rescue was

discontinuing ambulance service effective Feb 20th. For emergencies call 911. Docks and Services said they would resume work on the break-water the end of March or early April. Jack is looking into the new motor for the club. If it is available he might be able to put it on the ski barge while it is out of the water. We will be looking at another Honda. Discussion was held on trade in value versus having the motor for spare parts.

Activities Captain's Report: Judy reported that everyone seemed pleased with the location of the Awards Party and a great time was had by all. She has contacted many of the new members for the New Kids on the Dock party on March 24th and reminded the board that we are helping with the event. She plans on having a preregistration for the junior program like they did last year.

Fleet Captain's Report: Chris noted that the Awards Party was a great success. He has a few awards that were not picked up that evening and he will be emailing the winners that he has them. He discussed the racing season. He also noted that we would not be hosting the Sunfish Regionals. Danny suggested we have a rules seminar. Chris will look into that and possibly a PRO meeting.

Windword Editor: Barbara sent out 6 hard copies of the Windword and they were in color. Several people had commented on enjoying the crossword puzzle. She is continuing to look at fun items for the Windword.

Treasurer's Report: Tom distributed the financials for the month. 89% of the renewals have been returned. 13 memberships were not renewed

VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT

Can you feel it? Springtime is here, and that means sailing season. It is time to get out and go sailing. Sometimes that means doing a little (or a lot) of work on the boat. Daylight savings time just started, and you should be able to find time to get out and get the things ready for the cruising or racing seasons. Be sure to check out Judy's article for all the details on the "New Kids On The Dock" party. The gist is the BOG hosts a party for all the newer members of the Club. They get out and help us prepare a lunch for all of us. Everyone is introduced and talks about their sailing experiences, whether short or long. It is a pretty interesting time, and helps put names and faces together. The party starts a 1pm, so come out and sail before or after the lunch.

A couple of regattas will be held this year outside our normal ones. In June Windycrest will host the "Osage Hills Rendevous Regatta", the Snipe District 2 Championship. Steve Snider is the Regatta Chairman and expects around 20 teams for the event. On September 14-16 Windycrest will host the Women's North American Sunfish Master's Regatta. Through the work of Jack Stewart, the general upkeep of the Club is in good condition. The Facilities Committee is working on plans for the Work Party in May. I plan to have a list of projects and assignment schedule in the April Windword.





CLUB RULES

Regulatory Rules

1. All U. S. Coast Guard regulations, Corps of Engineers regulations, and Oklahoma State laws that apply to Keystone Lake shall apply to Windycrest Sailing Club.
2. Each boat must have one U. S. Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) for each person on board. Boats with more than one person aboard must also carry one throwable lifesaving flotation device.
3. Children under age 12 shall wear a personal flotation device (PFD) when on any Windycrest dock. When motoring, state law requires children (age 12 and under) to wear an approved PFD on board any boat 27 feet in length or less.

COLD WATER TIPS

Cold water shock is a major factor in boating fatalities when water temperatures are less than 70 degrees F. Cold water shock causes an involuntary gasp reflex (often resulting in aspiration of water), hyperventilation, breathlessness and a reduced ability to control breathing and to swim. Those wearing a life jacket when exposed to cold water have potentially life-saving advantages such as insulation from the cold, buoyancy and reduced risk of aspiration of water.

Here are some cold water survival safety tips:

- * Always wear a life jacket, even when not required. Many models also offer insulation from cold air.
- * Never boat alone.
- * Leave a float plan and know the waters you plan to boat.
- * Bring a fully-charged cell phone with you in case of emergency.
- * Wear clothing that still insulates when wet such as fleece, polypropylene or other synthetics.
- * If you are about to fall into cold water, cover your mouth and nose with your hands. This will reduce the likelihood of inhaling water.
- * If possible, stay with the boat. Get back into or climb on top of the boat.
- * While in the water, do not remove your clothing in cold water.
- * If you can't get out of the water, get into the Heat Escape Lessening Posture (HELP).
- * Once out of the water, get out of the wet clothes and warmed up as soon as possible.

Classes: All boats welcome. Four boats in the same class make a fleet. All others sail in an appropriate handicap fleet.

Rules: The ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012 as adopted and amended by US SAILING, CSSA Sailing Instructions and the local appendix will govern races. All boats shall conform to class rules as applicable.

Safety: Standard safety equipment required including throwables and signaling device (16ft+ boats). Lake patrol requires skippers to carry photo ID.

Scoring: Low Point System:
1 for 1st, 2 for 2nd, 3 for 3rd, etc.
Boats must have a sail number to be scored

Classes: All boats welcome. Four boats in the same class make a fleet. All others sail in an appropriate handicap fleet.

Handicapping: Current US SAILING Portsmouth System. Skippers should verify that a US SAILING Portsmouth D-PN number has been established for their boat.

Trophies: 4 boats in a fleet = 1 trophy; 8 boats = 2 trophies; 12 boats = 3 trophies; 16 boats = 4 trophies. 1st place crew and other special awards.

Housing: Free Camping at Club with bathhouse. Some RV Space Available. Hotels in Sand Springs and Tulsa

Facilities: Open pavilion, modern bathhouse, 3-boat wide ramp, ample parking, mast-raising device, water storage for keelboats, tie-up dock, board boat dock. Convenience store one mile from the club.
